Welcome to the first instalment of the Yorkshire Arboretum's 2023 events and activities programme.

Summer and Autumn editions will appear later in the year, all offering a wide range of things to do in and around the arboretum. We very much hope that you'll find something of interest for you, family and friends.

The most exciting development this year is the opening of our Red Squirrel Enclosure, which we know has been eagerly anticipated. Our aim is to enable visitors to learn more about these delightful native mammals, now extinct across much of the country.

The enclosure is large, enclosing a grove of oaks and other trees, in which the Red Squirrels can live natural active lives, hopefully breeding to enhance the captive stock that may be used in future for reintroduction programmes. As with any animal they will have their 'down times' and may not always be visible, but we hope that you will enjoy the experience of visiting the enclosure, whether or not you get a glimpse of a squirrel. Entry to the enclosure is free but must be pre-booked online to ensure that the boardwalk does not become too crowded, and there are necessary rules to protect the squirrels that must be followed please, particularly no dogs, no feeding, and to keep the doors shut.

I very much hope you enjoy your visit to the Yorkshire Arboretum, whatever you come to do: every visit supports our charitable work and the maintenance of this beautiful and unique place.

The Red Squirrel Project at the Yorkshire Arboretum provides an opportunity to learn more about this beautiful yet increasingly rare native mammal.

The aim of the project is to boost Red Squirrel numbers in Britain by providing space for a new breeding colony, and educate about the threats and disease Grey Squirrels cause for Red Squirrels, trees, and woodland.
