WHAT AM I? For KS1

Q: I am oval and hard on the outside. I may grow into a bird. I rhyme with leg. What am I?

Q: I am fluffy and run fast. I live in fields. I rhyme with habit. What am I?

Q: I am feathery and have a beak. I am sometimes yellow, brown or white. I rhyme with flick. What am I?

Q: I live in the pond. I have 4 legs with webbed feet. I rhyme with dog. What am I?

Q: I am a bit larger than a rabbit. I have very long ears. I rhyme with dare. What am I?

WHAT AM I? For KS2

Q: I am an amphibian. I lay strings of eggs encased in jelly. I rhyme with road. What am I?

Q: I eat fish in rivers, streams and lakes. My thick fur traps air to keep me warm and buoyant. I rhyme with rotter! What am I?

Q: My name means thick furred tail. My young are called cub, pup, or kit. I rhyme with box. What am I?

Q: I am a white water-dwelling bird. I prepare me nest when there is still ice on the ground. I rhyme with gone. What am I?

Q: I am a grazing animal. The male is called a buck and the female a doe. I rhyme with peer. What am I? **Q:** I use the water for feeding. Male and female birds share the incubating of the eggs. I rhyme with melon. What am I?

What am I? Plants

Q: I am a prickly plant. I can have red berries and people think of me at Christmas time! What am I?

Q: I am tree found in a woodland and my seed is an acorn. I am a deciduous tree and lose leaves in autumn. I rhyme with poke. What am I?

Q: I am an evergreen tree and my seed is a cone. My needles stay on all year round. I rhyme with mine. What am I?

Q: I am a tree with a name from ancient times, when horse remedies were made from me. My seeds can be used to play conkers in the autumn. My name is sounds like a combination of an animal and a nut. What am I? **Q:** I am a tall thin tree. My bark is white in parts and my flowers are grouped in an inflorescence called a catkin. I rhyme with church. What am I?

Q: I am a small tree. I have catkins which turn into late summer nuts used for nut and chocolate spread. I rhyme with nasal. What am I?
